Ms. Osterman presented a memorandum (on file) on the above referenced project regarding, (HCAEF), requesting an additional \$32,491 in State funds funds to match county funds committed on April 4, 2018.

Mr. Henderson moved to approve the committee recommendation, as recommended; Mr. Giesecke seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2017-0211 Kentucky Association of Food Banks, Inc.

Mr. Baker presented a memorandum (on file) on the above referenced request, regarding extending the buying of Kentucky-grown fruits and vegetables from August 31 to October 31, and to be allowed to include feeding children who are eligible for the Child & Adult Care Food Program.

Ms. Butler moved to approve the committee recommendation, as recommended; Mr. Foree seconded the motion.

Presentation

Cindy Finneseth, Executive Director, Kentucky Horticulture Council presented on the status of the organization, as part of the KADB's 2018 Review Strategy for Statewide investments.

Ms. Finneseth discussed the Kentucky Horticulture Council programs and addressed the following questions posed by the board:

- 1. Of your program/service categories, which have had the most impact on profitability at the farm level?
- 2. If you were to eliminate a program/service category, which would it be?
- 3. How do you see your organization in five years if you had no KADF funding?

New Business

New Applications for Referral¹

Commissioner Quarles called on Mr. McCloskey to present new applications for referral.

Mr. McCloskey referenced two (2) new applications for referral.

Mr. Hughes moved to refer the submitted applications to the appropriate committees; Ms. Butler seconded the motion.

Programs Recommended for Approval²

Commissioner Quarles called on Mr. McCloskey to present programs recommended for approval.

Mr. McCloskey referenced five (5) County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP) applications requesting county funds totaling \$952,444: One (1) Youth Ag Incentives Program requesting funds totaling \$15,000. This makes the total programs funding \$967,444.

Mr. McCloskey stated that Menifee County, at this time, has no updated county council; therefore, the request for \$69,950 in CAIP funds must be pended, per board policy, making the total requested funds today \$897,494.

Mr. Hughes moved to approve the program recommendations, as presented; Dr. Jones seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

Requested Program Amendments³

Commissioner Quarles called on Mr. McCloskey to present requested program amendments.

Mr. McCloskey referenced two (2) requested program amendments seeking additional county funds totaling \$55,000.

Dr. Jones moved to approve the program amendments as presented; Dean Cox seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

Commissioner Quarles yielded the chair to Keith Rogers.

Project Recommendations for Funding

Mr. Rogers called on Joe Montgomery and Biff Baker, to present the following recommendations for funding:

A2018-0143 Wingfield Volunteer Fire Department, Inc.

Mr. Montgomery referenced the above application from the Wingfield Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., requesting up to \$890 in Edmonson County to purchase two (2) turtle tube grain bin rescue devices.

The White Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for \$890 in Edmonson County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Giesecke moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Foree seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2018-0145 University of Kentucky Research Foundation

Mr. Baker referenced the above application, from the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, requesting up to \$486,085 in State funds over two (2) years to support the State Viticulture and Enology Extension Program.

The White Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$486,085 in State funds subject to terms and conditions.

A2018-0156 Kentucky Department of Agriculture

Mr. Montgomery referenced the above application from the Kentucky Department of Agriculture requesting up to \$525,000 in State funds over a two (2) year period to continue to fund the Kentucky Grape and Wine Council.

The White Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$525,000 in State funds.

Mr. Rogers called for a five minute recess.

Patsy Wilson, UK Extension Specialist: Viticulture, explained that the Grape and Wine Council focuses more on the marketing side, while the Research Foundation focuses on growth hardiness, growing season, pruning, canopy management, overwintering etc.

Mr. Rogers stated the program used to be funded out of the general fund, but was not funded in the last biennial budget. He also pointed out that Kentucky Department of Agriculture still supports the administrative needs of the Grape and Wine Council.

Mr. Foree moved to table this project; Mr. Henderson seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives Program Funding⁴

Mr. McCloskey presented a memorandum (on file) regarding the 2018 On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives Program Round 2 applications.

The On-Farm Energy Committee recommends approving the eight (8) requests for a total of \$68,190.

Ms. Henderson moved to approve the committees recommendation, as presented; Mr. Pedigo seconded the motion.
